didacticism romanticism and classicism are the possible schemata for the knotting of art and philosophy the third term in this knot being the education of subjects youth in particular what characterizes the century that has just come to a close is that while it underwent the saturation of these three schemata it failed to introduce a new one today this predicament tends to produce a kind of unknotting of terms a desperate dis relation between art and philosophy together with the pure and simple collapse of what circulated between them the theme of education whence the thesis of which this book is nothing but a series of variations faced with such a situation of saturation and closure we must attempt to propose a new schema a fourth type of knot between philosophy and art among these inaesthetic variations the reader will encounter a sustained debate with contemporary philosophical uses of the poem bold articulations of the specificity and prospects of theater cinema and dance along with subtle and provocative readings of fernando pessoa stéphane mallarmé and samuel beckett

humans have engaged in artistic and aesthetic activities since the appearance of our species our ancestors have decorated their bodies tools and utensils for over 100 000 years the expression of meaning using color line sound rhythm or movement among other means constitutes a fundamental aspect of our species biological and cultural heritage art and aesthetics therefore contribute to our species identity and distinguish it from its living and extinct relatives science is faced with the challenge of explaining the natural foundations of such a unique trait and the way cultural processes nurture it into magnificent expressions historically and ethnically unique how do the human mind and brain bring about these sorts of behaviors what psychological and neural processes underlie the appreciation of painting music and dance how does training modulate these processes are humans the only species capable of aesthetic appreciation or are other species endowed with the rudiments of this capacity empirical examinations of such questions have a long and rich history in the discipline of psychology the genesis of which can be traced back to the publication of gustav theodor fechner s *vorschule der aesthetik* in 1876 making it the second oldest branch in experimental psychology the oxford handbook of empirical aesthetics brings together leading experts in psychology neuroimaging art history and philosophy to answer

these questions it provides the most comprehensive coverage of the domain of empirical aesthetics to date with sections on visual art dance music and many other art forms and aesthetic phenomena the breadth of this volume's scope reflects the richness and variety of topics and methods currently used today by scientists to understand the way our mind and brain endow us with the faculty to produce and appreciate art and aesthetics

art has not always had the same salience in philosophical discussions of ethics that many other elements of our lives have there are well defined areas of applied ethics corresponding to nature business health care war punishment animals and more but there is no recognized research program in applied ethics of the arts or art ethics art often seems to belong to its own sphere of value separate from morality the first questions we ask about art are usually not about its moral rightness or virtue but about its beauty or originality however it is impossible to do any serious thinking about the arts without engaging in ethical questions

explaining what art is and what's not art what is art why do we find some things beautiful but not others is it wrong to share mp3s these are just some of the questions explored by aesthetics the philosophy of art in this sweeping introduction charles taliaferro skilfully guides us through different theories of art and beauty tackling issues such as who owns art and what happens when art and morality collide from plato on poetry to ringo starr on the drums this is a perfect introductory text for anyone interested in the fascinating questions art can raise

human flourishing depends upon the mental health of the individuals throughout history various cultural traditions have established

and practiced diverse strategies to maintain their community members mental health treat their mental illness and enhance their well being they range from spiritual disciplines religious rituals and philosophical training to communal activities educational instructions and community support it is noteworthy that aesthetic objects and activities are frequently integrated into these strategies they include visual arts music dance story telling theatre and occasions and events made special by certain foods drinks decorations clothes and fragrance this long held and widely practiced integration of aesthetics into promotion of mental health testifies to the power of the aesthetic to affect the well being of humans and their communities the world s major philosophies and religious traditions have recognized this power of the aesthetic for example plato s proposed censorship of the arts in his utopian republic indicates his acknowledgement of and a respect for the power of the arts to mold the citizens psyche and character confucianism also utilizes arts and rituals to promote moral virtues finally buddhism teaches the cultivation of mindful practice for human flourishing by developing an alternative relationship with present moment experience such as suffering and distress today the most dominant methods of treating mental illness in the west are psychotherapy psychology and psychiatry methodologies and practices established and developed in europe since the nineteenth century ever since the birth of art and poetry its purpose has been to inspire stir and move people this handbook addresses the valuable role aesthetics plays in psychotherapy and psychiatry exploring both theory and practice

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
